- 1. Jib boom 10mm from top of hook to middle of boom.
- 2. Jib boom deck attachment 74mm from front of boom
- 3. Front of mast 176mm from forward eyelet on deck.
- 4. Jib and Main Juffs to be lose all times.

Sheet in the sails then carry out the following tuning.

Main

- 5. Main. Middle of foot 20-25mm from boom center
- 6. Main boom end should be in middle of boat
- 7. Main leach to be 60-70 mm to backstay in center. Loosen vang to increase length.
- 8. Longer, 70-75 mm on windy days which can be accomplished by tightening back stay.
- 9. Shorter on light days 55-60mm

Jib

- 10. Jib. Middle of foot 20-25 mm from boom center
- 11. Jib boom end to be 40-45 mm from center of mast
- 12. If boat rounds up when sailing (Weather helm) shorten distance to mast
- 13. If boat bears away (Lee helm) then lengthen distance to mast.
- 14. Jib leach 40-50mm from leach tensioning line

Other Tips

- Make sure leach curve is the same on jib and main.
- Sail outhauls can be tightened in heavier air.
- Work the main upwind.
- Let main off a little before tacking and bring in after the tack when boat is moving.
- Light airs let off main sheet a bit.
- Limit rudder movement as this slows the boat.
- Put tell tales on sails. Use cassette tape. Make 3-4 inches long.
